

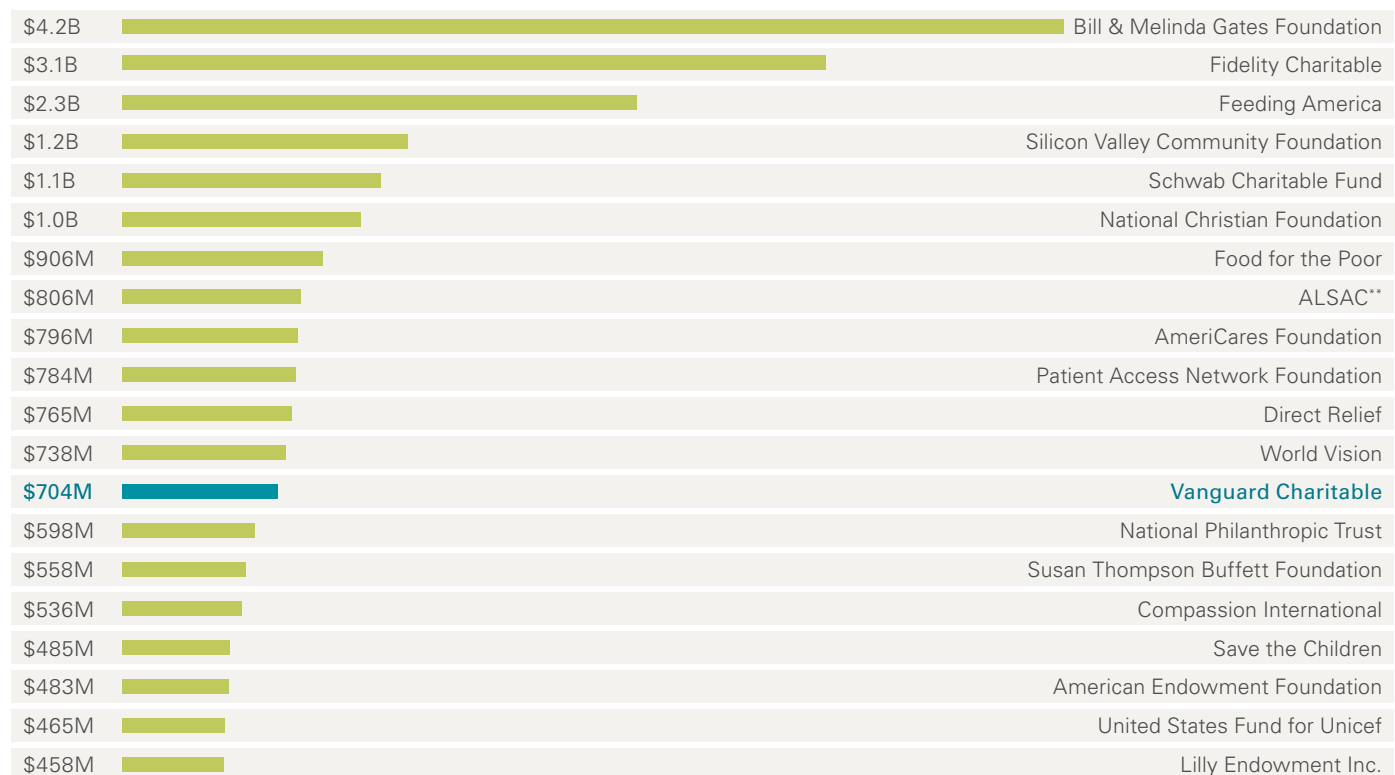
America's top grantmakers
